Directions:

1. Select the parent with whom you are having a conflict and/or misunderstanding. The conflict should be one that cannot be resolved with a single effective “I” Statement (such as I am feeling...when you...and I would appreciate it if you would... Are you willing to do that?” and the person agrees). The conflict should require negotiation and the use of all the conflict resolution skills outlined on the Conflict Resolution Skill Card ([Parent Conflict Resolution Project Module](#)). Suppose a parent decides not to participate in this project or cannot participate. In that case, you may do it with someone else who you come in regular contact with and who is your age or older, who will be able and willing to complete the evaluation form after your conversation with them honestly, and then give you feedback following the directions on the PCRP Parent Assessment ([Parent Conflict Resolution Project Module](#)). If you will do it with someone other than a parent, you need my approval before having the conversation.
2. Give the parent you have chosen the Parent Letter ([Parent Conflict Resolution Project Module](#)), have them sign the Parent Signature Page, and bring it to our next class. They may keep the first page, which includes the list of resources. If you are doing it with someone other than a parent and have received my approval, give them the Parent Letter, have them sign the Parent Signature Page, and bring it to our next class.
3. Complete the Conflict Resolution Step 1 One Questions ([Parent Conflict Resolution Project Module](#)). Turn it in and get my approval before you have the conversation (wait until I return it to you). The Step 1 Questions must be turned in by... You will be asked to self-assess your answers to the Step 1 Questions using the Generic Rubric for Assessing Self-Awareness, Self-Insight, and Self-Knowledge, which will be part of your grade for this project.
4. Wait until I return the Conflict Resolution Step 1 Questions before having the conversation.
5. Once you complete the conversation, complete the Parent Communication Project Student Assessment ([Parent Conflict Resolution Project Module](#)) immediately after having the conversation. Have your parent complete the Parent Communication Project Parent Assessment ([Parent Conflict Resolution Project Module](#)) immediately after the discussion. When you and your parent have completed the evaluations, sit down with them and review your results. Directions for reviewing the results of the assessments are found in both the Student and Parent Communication Project Assessment.
6. Complete the Parent Communication Project Effort Evaluation, found in your Student Evaluation.
7. I will let you know when the project must be completed and when all materials must be returned.

You Will Be Graded on the Following:

1. Returning the Parent Communication Project Parent Signature Page on the due date. You will receive a grade of 100 if you return it within two classes. You will lose 5 points for each additional class period it is late.
2. Self-evaluation of your Parent Communication Project Step 1 Questions using the Generic Rubric for Assessing Self-Awareness, Self-Insight, and Self-Knowledge.
3. Completion of your Student PCRCP Self-Assessment. You will not be graded on your skill level.
4. Self-assessment of your answers to questions 22, 23, 24, and 25 on your Parent Communication Project Student Assessment using the Generic Rubric for Assessing Self-Awareness, Self-Insight, and Self-Knowledge.
5. Teacher assessment of your answers to questions 22, 23, 24, and 25 on their Parent Communication Project Student Assessment using the Generic Rubric for Assessing Self-Awareness, Self-Insight, and Self-Knowledge Rubric For Self-Awareness.
6. Return of the Parent Communication Project Parent Evaluation.
7. Self-evaluation of your effort during the project.
